



SECONDARY UNIFORM

The school uniform is principally established to create our individual school identity and encourage a positive learning environment that curbs the possibility of student discrimination.

Family collaboration is necessary to ensure that students come to school wearing the complete uniform (including all the minor aspects).

SCHOOL UNIFORM (WORN THREE DAYS A WEEK)

- Polo shirt (long or short-sleeved)
- Trousers, shorts, or skirt
- School cardigan
- Grey/black socks or tights *
- Black shoes or trainers that are completely black, soles included. Boots are allowed as long as they do not have buckles, studs or high platforms. *
- Laboratory coat and Technology/Art coat (it is required to buy two different coats)
- Uniform jacket

SPORTS UNIFORM (WORN TWO DAYS A WEEK)

- Sports kit (complete tracksuit: jumper and trousers)
- Summer sports kit (shorts)
- Sports t-shirt (short-sleeved)
- White socks *
- Trainers (any colour is allowed, but the footwear must be specific to the subject activity) *

SECONDARY EDUCATION SCHOOL UNIFORM RULES

- The school uniform must be worn from the first day of school.
- All articles of clothing must be labelled to avoid loss or mix ups.
- Students must wear black shoes or trainers (completely black, sole included) as part of the school uniform.
- The sports uniform is obligatory and exclusive to days when students have physical education class.
- The sports uniform and formal school uniform are not to be worn together.
- The following elements are not permitted: facial/body piercings, visible tattoos, unnatural or bright hair colours/completely shaved hair, use of cap/hat inside buildings.

- Excessively short skirts are not permitted (must not be more than 15 cm above the knee).
- For security reasons, the lab coat must remain completely white throughout the course.
- Female students can wear the school uniform trousers, should they wish to do so.

Students who do not comply with these rules will not be permitted to enter classes. In the case of non-compliance, the school will contact the family to resolve the issue.

In the case of repeated non-compliance with this regulation, the measures established in the School's Behaviour for Learning Policy will be applied.
